### CHOOSE A BIRD!

1. Go to the Bird Migration Explorer home page:  
explorer.audubon.org
2. Click "Bird Species."
3. Choose one of the bird names below and circle it.

4. Now type the name of the bird you've chosen in the white search space in the Explorer. Be careful to spell it correctly. When the name pops up below, click it.
